This schedule assumes two classes per grade level (K-5); 250-500 students. The set for the show is provided. Costumes and props will be made out of “found” objects. Parents are asked to donate paper bags, paper plates, scrap material and other such objects. School should be ready to provide paint, markers, scissors and other such craft items. School will also be asked to send notices to parents. And School will need to provide supervision (parent volunteers) for after-school workshops and the Saturday session.

Classes are 30-45 minutes long and can be adapted to fit your school schedule. Acting/Theatre classes require movement and should meet in a large indoor space.

- The 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> graders meet every day. The first two days focus on writing the script. The final three are for rehearsing the play they have written. 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> graders are given writing assignments which may have to be completed as homework.
- 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> graders focus on musical theatre. Each class writes and performs a musical number in the show. The class meets on 4 days.
- K and 1<sup>st</sup> graders learn basic theatre skills and perform an ensemble piece. The class meets on 2 days.

Participation in the family night is not mandatory but is highly encouraged. Main characters will be cast accordingly. Attendance for the Saturday and after-school workshops are voluntary. The school may choose to serve dinner after the Family Night show on Tuesday and/or lunch for the volunteers on Saturday.

Please arrange for parking and electricity for a small RV and trailer (35 feet long) on campus for the week, beginning on the Tuesday night before the first day.
